Brunei Darussalam Agriculture and Agrifood Statistics in Brief is an annual publication of the Department of Agriculture and Agrifood, Ministry of Primary Resources and Tourism. Its main aim is to disseminate and share the annual up-to-date statistical data on agriculture gross output production, land areas developed, numbers of participating farmers/entrepreneurs as well as data on agriculture labour force and other related information.

Once again, the Department of Agriculture and Agrifood has been able to collect relevant statistical data and produce a statistical book for the year 2022.

Generally, Agricultural development achievement trend for a period of 10 years shows the output value of the agriculture and agrifood sector growing at an average rate of 82.9% (CAGR : 6.94%), which is from \$314.82 million in 2013 to \$575.71 million in 2022.

Through the publication of this statistical book, I fully hope that, apart from being a reference material, it will also be able to be used as an incentive for all of us, including the farmers, especially the youth, to continue to commit to working harder so that the output from this sector will continue to grow and

increase in the future, and contribute significantly in supporting efforts towards increasing and diversifying the country's economic resources. Finally, I would like to congratulate to all those involved in contributing energy and ideas to ensure the success of the publication of the statistical book on the development of the agricultural and agrifood sector.

The Department will continue to improve this publication from time to time in line with the increasing demand and current statistical development. Comments and suggestions for further improvements on the contents and tabulation specifications in this publication are most welcome.

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# AGRICULTURE AT A GLANCE

One of the targets of Brunei Vision 2035 is to make Brunei Darussalam a country with a dynamic and sustainable economy. As such, the agriculture and agrifood sector is one of the main sectors that can contribute to the country's diversification efforts and growth of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP).

In ensuring the security of food supply and enhancement of the economic contribution to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), Brunei Darussalam places much importance in agriculture and agrifood development. In this respect, DoAA actively promotes the development of various agricultural commodities as well as facilitating the outsourcing of raw materials and food supply.

The gross output value of the agriculture and agrifood sector for the period of 2018 to 2022 has seen an increase by 31.0 per cent, that is, an increase of B\$439.32 million in 2018 to B\$575.71 million in 2022.

The major contribution comes from the Livestock Industry, which account for about 60.6 per cent of the total gross output of the agriculture and agrifood sector, followed by Agrifood Industry about 29.3 per cent and Crop Industry about 10.1 per cent.

It is hoped that the growth outlook of the agriculture and agrifood sector in 2022 onwards will continue to grow. DoAA will continue to ensure that the growth of this sector will remain positive by ensuring strategies and initiatives to boost production and productivity continue to be implemented, such as through the Agriculture Pilot Project, Contract Farming for youth, Business Expansion Program, Local Market Facilitation, Export Market Facilitation, as well as opening up of new areas for crops, livestock and paddy production.

# THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND AGRIFOOD

Agriculture and Agrifood are the major source of the primary resources and agrifood processing based on agriculture sectors which contributes to the growth of GDP, Export and Economic Diversification.

Aligned with the Ministry of Primary Resources and Tourism's Strategic Plan 2020 - 2022, it is expected that Agricultural productions will increase exponentially whereby the Livestock and Crop Industry will be the main contributor followed by the increase in Agrifood Processing Industry. In effort to further develop the agriculture sector, especially in livestock and crop production, the DOAA is encouraging the involvement of local and foreign investors and increasing access to local and export market.

The strategic thrust of the Department of Agriculture and Agrifood are:-

## GROWTH

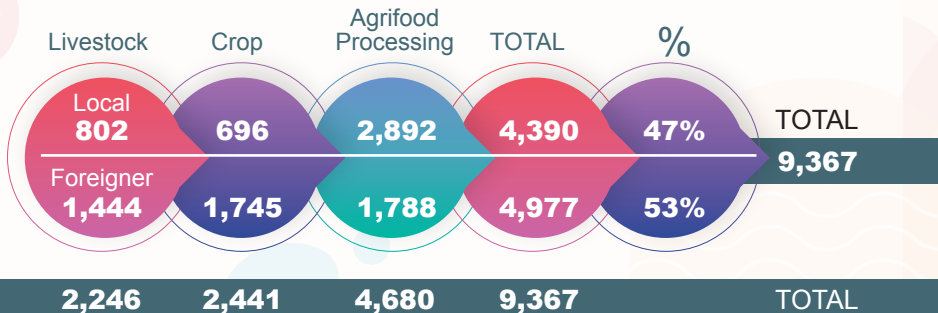

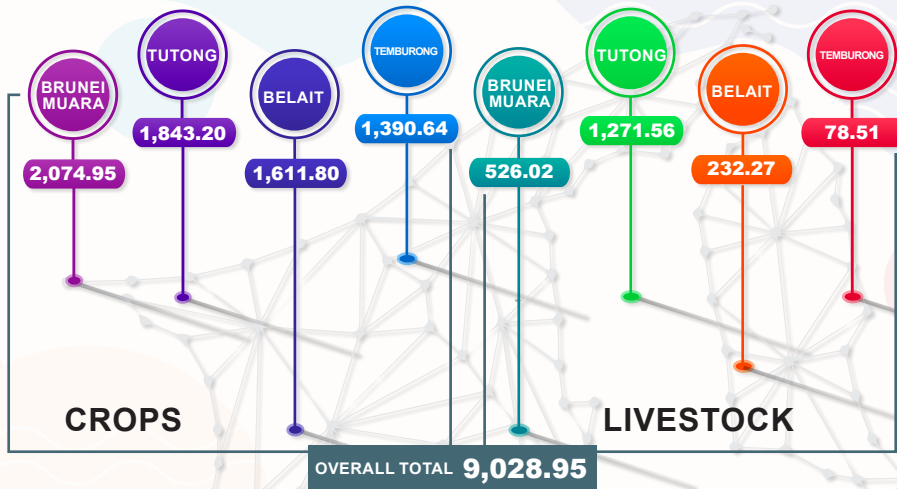
## AGRICULTURE LABOUR FORCE

(Hectares)

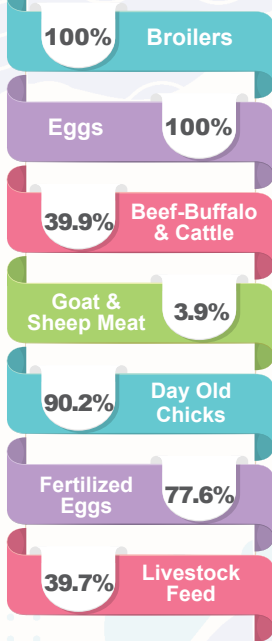

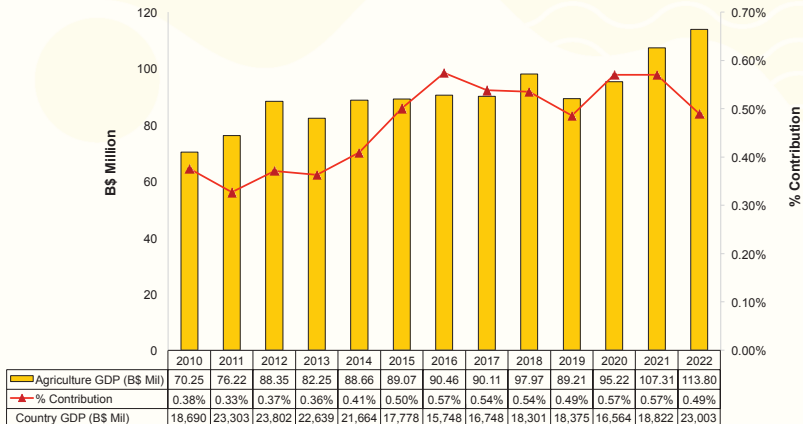

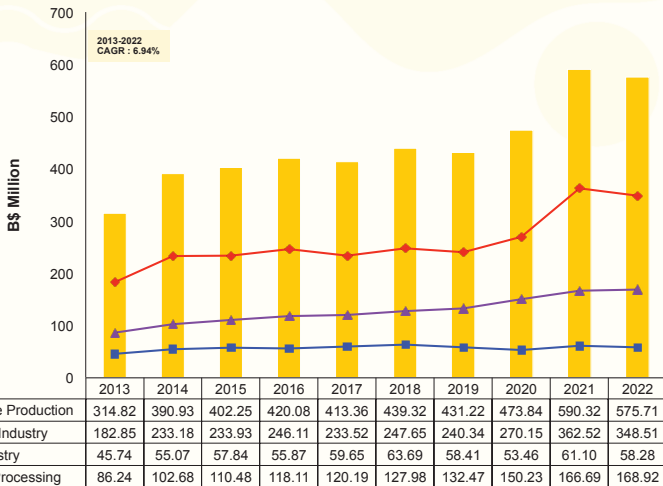
# AGRICULTURE GDP

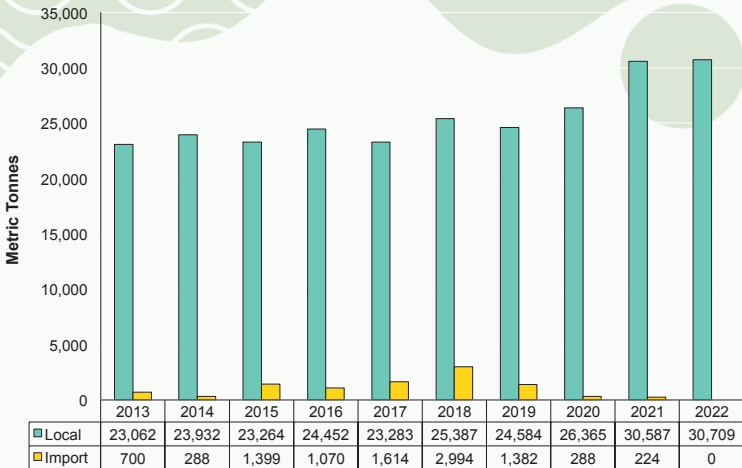

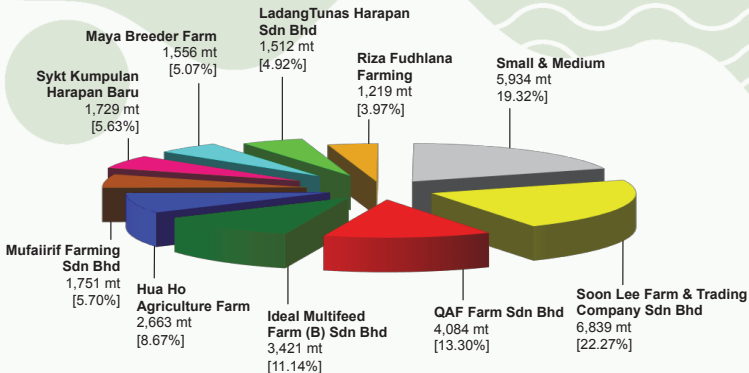
# BROILER INDUSTRY 2013 – 2022

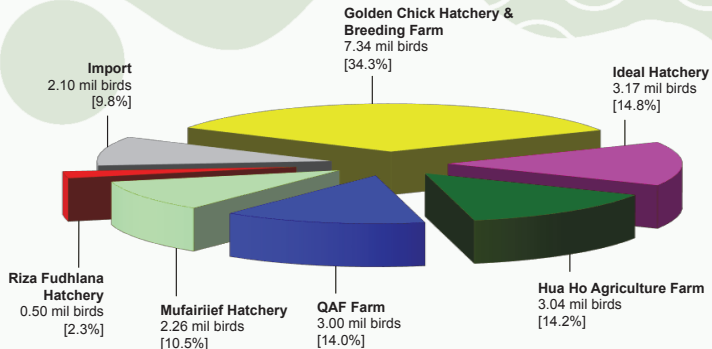

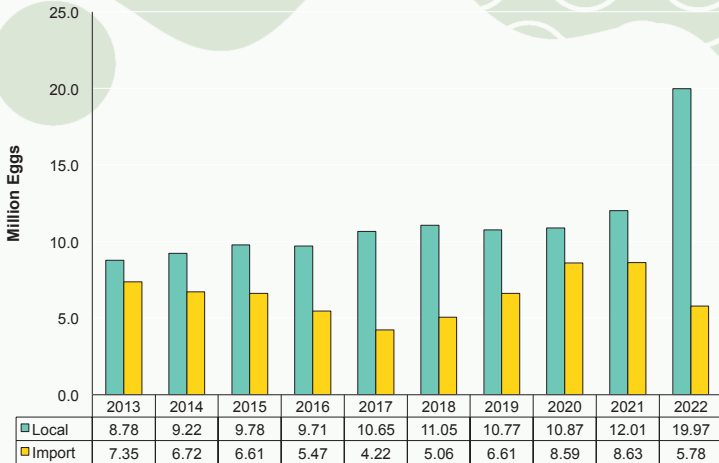

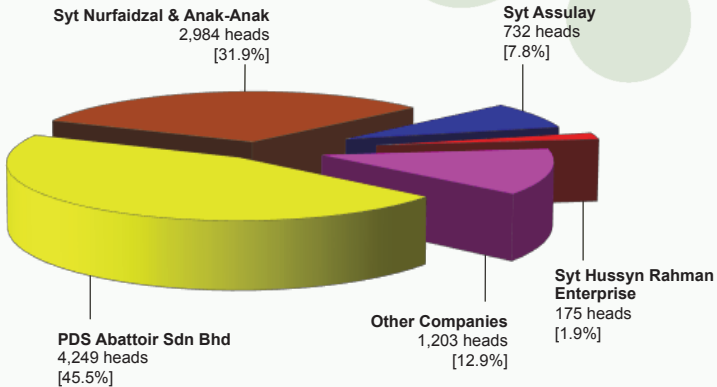

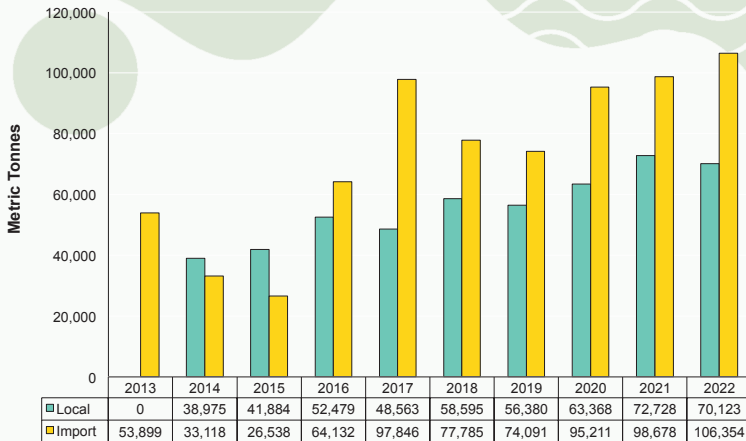

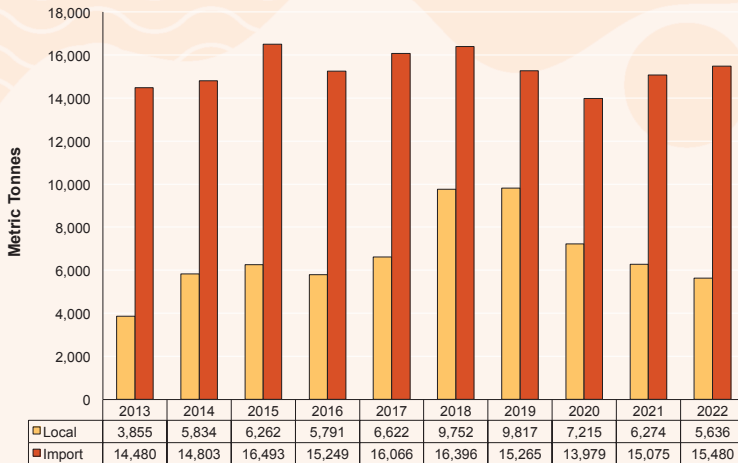

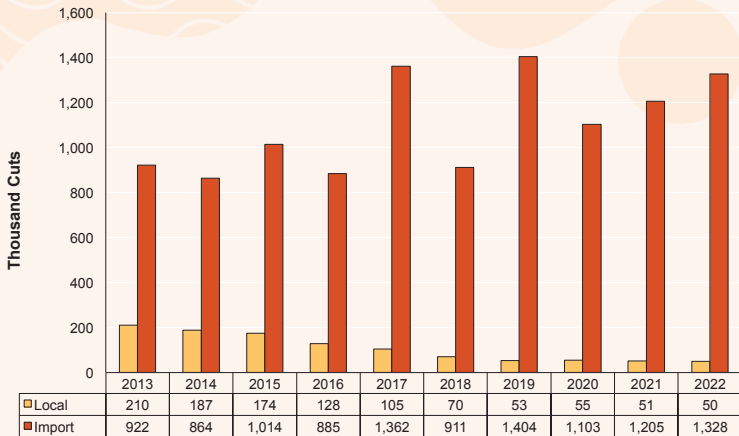

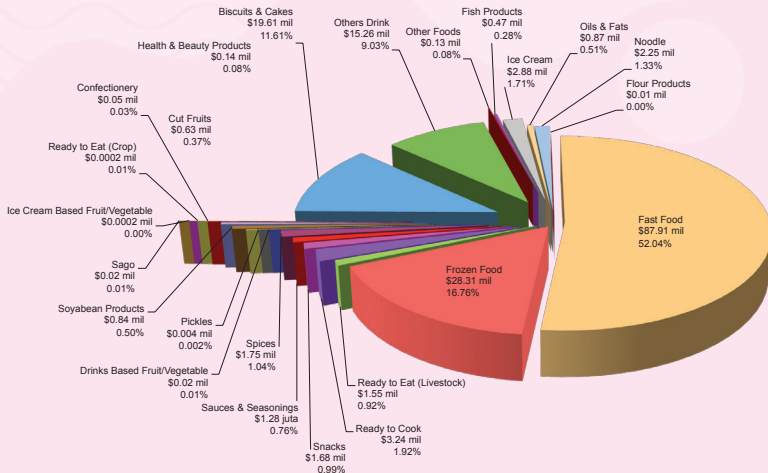

# AGRIFOOD INDUSTRY BY CATEGORY 2022



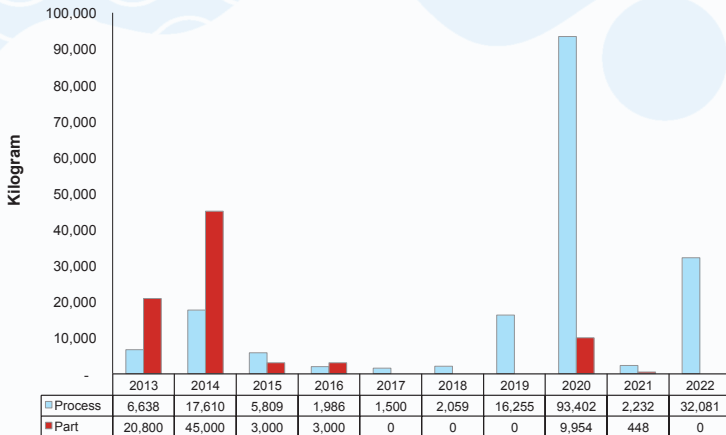

# EXPORT TREND OF LIVESTOCK PRODUCT 2013 - 2022

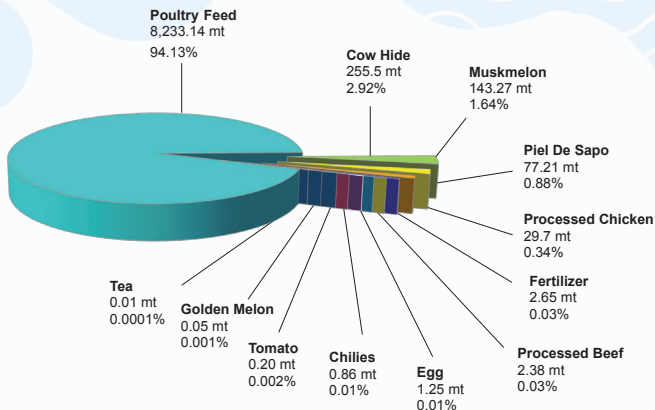

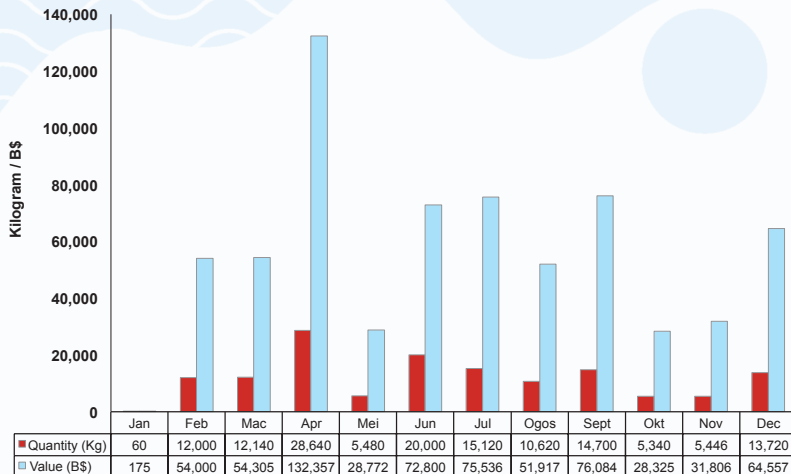
# EXPORT OF AGRICULTURE & AGRIFOOD PRODUCTS 2022

# EXPORT OF JAPANESE MUSKMELON 2022



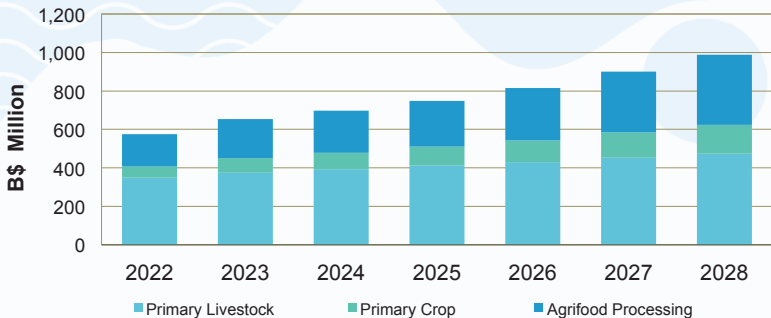
